We are glad so many of you could join us for the first "official" ONTEORA Reunion Weekend. You have become part of "OSR History in the Making," an adventure that began forty-five years ago when the Nassau County Council first purchased this land in the sky.

It was an adventure that some thought had ended in 1991, when the OSR summer program was closed due to declining camp attendance, Scout enrollment and Council funds.

Some intrepid Scouters never gave up—their troops continued to camp over summer weeks and winter weekends, introducing new generations of Scouts to the magic that is ONTEORA.

With the blessings and support of the Theodore Roosevelt Council, an amazing team of volunteers (OSR alumni & friends) came together four years ago to reopen our summer camp. And for the 4th consecutive year, ONTEORA SCOUT RESERVATION has been recognized as a fully-

accredited camp by the Boy Scouts of America. A visitation team of volunteer Scouters from five area Councils and a representative of the Boy Scouts Regional Office rigorously surveyed the camp facilities and programs, and measured them against over 100 written standards. We passed on each and every one!

As you tour the Admin Building, take note of the pennants proudly displayed—ONTEORA Buckskin Camp consistently achieved an A rating, garnering incredible praise from the visitation team.

"Outstanding" and "Excellent" were common words used by the team to describe the camp's staff, programs, and the experience campers were having in the various program areas. The team remarked that ONTEORA offers the "best program we have ever seen in the Northeast Region."

Camp Commissioner Dave Barkstedt stressed that an impor-

tant part of the process of reopening the camp has been the volunteer staff. "We have been very fortunate to have people who staffed OSR summer camp years ago return from around the country to staff again!" Camp Director Jim Kent adds: "Our success as a camp is due to teamwork among the staff, troops, and all the others who made this work."

The adventure continues thanks to the support of interested Scouts and Scouters throughout Nassau County—and beyond, as attested to by your attendance this weekend!

The Camp Wish List for 2002 includes:

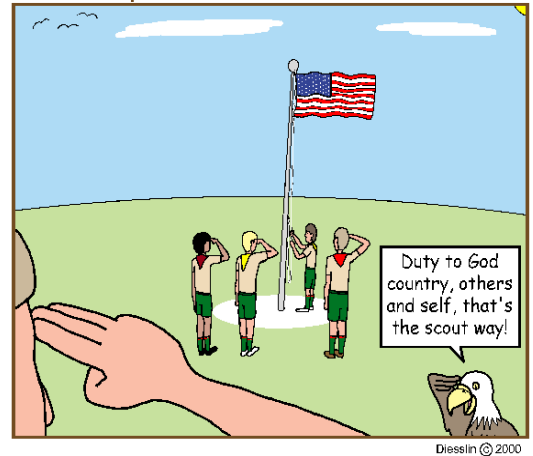

Patriotism and prayer has returned to them. It never left us. For that we owe thanks to our families & scoutmasters who instilled in us the scout oath & law.

NEWS & NOTES FROM OSR 2001

This summer OSR welcomed home 481 Scouts and 127 Scouters from 36 troops, in addition to the 115 volunteer staffers who gave all or part of 3 weeks to ready the camp. (Bully to Order of the Arrow members for their phenomenal work weekend!)

When OSR reopened in 1998, 80 volunteer staffers welcomed 150 scouts from 14 units.

Even more important than the growing support and attendance is our staff development. The CIT program over the past four years has concentrated on training 16-21 year old staff members, the majority of whom now have 2-4 years experience working in camp program areas.

By 2003, when our full-summer camp program reopens, we will have many 21-year-old senior staff with 5 years of OSR staff experience! These male and female scouts are being prepared to take over for the core of adult volunteers who have spent the past four years training their replace-

ments while they serve as counselors for the campers!

By the way, this year's staff counseled campers to a record 1,225 merit badges (with 300 partials)!
