## ORCHARD LAKE CLUB ELECTS

Sullivan County Colony of  
Fishermen Names Two  
New Directors

New York, Feb. 8—The Orchard Lake Club, which maintains a trout propagating, fishing, and hunting preserve near Livingston Manor, elected two new directors at its annual meeting at the Princeton Club last Tuesday, to succeed Milton H. Yale and William T. Yale of Jamaica. They are Lomax Littlejohn of Brooklyn, and J. Bradley Scott, of Newburgh. Roberson L. Low was re-elected. The other directors are William M. Harrison, C. Eustace Knooland, Richmond Weed, Louis Stearns, F. S. Smith and George B. Hodgman. Mr. Harrison is president of the club.

At the dinner after the annual meeting Wright Huntington, editor of The Game Breeder and leader of a national movement to propagate game, addressed the club, and members who were called on for speeches told of the prosperous condition of the club property. It is expected that the hatchery will yield 250,000 fry this year, most of which will be used to restock the lake and stream on the preserve. The club has a membership of about 60 and owns some 500 acres. Its clubhouse and cottage are kept open from May to October.
