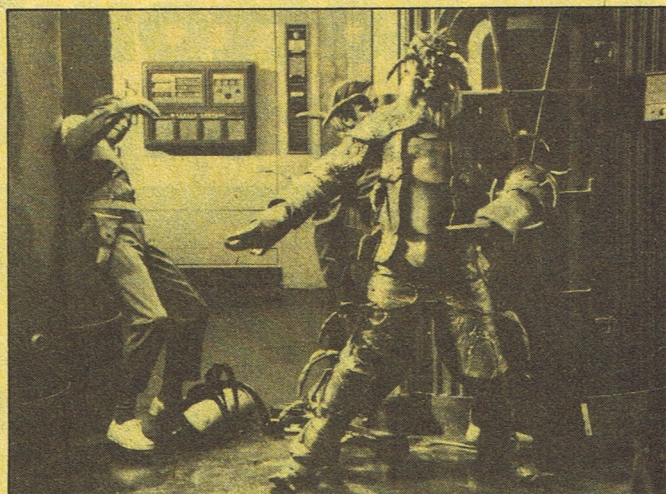

### ELEVEN DAYS TO ZERO

The pilot episode introduces the submarine SEAVIEW and its creator, Admiral Harriman Nelson (Basehart). The opening narration describes the SEAVIEW as "an instrument of marine research, while secretly the mightiest weapon afloat." Enroute to an emergency summit concerning unusual natural disasters Nelson and the SEAVIEW's commander, Captain John Phillips (Hudson), are ambushed and Phillips is killed. Nelson survives and presents his plan to counteract an impending earthquake using a nuclear device planted at the polar cap. The new captain of the SEAVIEW, Commander Lee Crane (Hedison), rushes Nelson and scientist Fred Wilson (Albert) to the Arctic for placement of the

device. The evil Dr. Gamma (Marcus) attempts to stop them so his unnamed foreign power can turn the world misfortunes to their advantage. Using footage from the feature, we see the SEAVIEW arrive, the bomb placed and detonated and the world saved.

### THE CITY BENEATH THE SEA

While searching for several lost ships, Crane poses as a diver and is hired by a cripple named Zeraff (Hatfield) to search for lost treasure. Crane soon finds that Zeraff is the leader of an underwater city whose inhabitants are determined to rule the world.

### THE FEAR MAKERS

After the submarine POLIDOR is lost due to errors made by a panicky crew, Nelson investigates with the aid of Dr. Arthur Kenner (Bergen) and Dr. Martin Davis (Bochner). Davis is using an experimental fear gas to sabotage America's undersea efforts, and places a canister of gas in the SEAVIEW's air duct system. As the crew grows more apprehensive, Nelson dives deeper, unaware (as is Davis) that the gas eventually turns to poison.

### THE MIST OF SILENCE

A *Mission Impossible*-type episode dealing with international politics in Latin America. One-by-one, the crew is executed until Nelson steals some of the gas and rescues them in a thrilling climax.

### THE PRICE OF DOOM

It should be noted that writer Ellison was displeased with the filmed version of his script; the credits list his pen name Cordwainer Bird.

Expert match-up of sets, costumes and cast from *The Lost World* allowed extensive use of stock footage.

### THE VILLAGE OF GUILT

The first TV encounter with a gigantic underwater creature (actually the squid from the feature). The creature is killed by a blast of electricity from the SEAVIEW's reactors. Good direction by producer Allen.

### HOT LINE

### SUBMARINE SUNK HERE

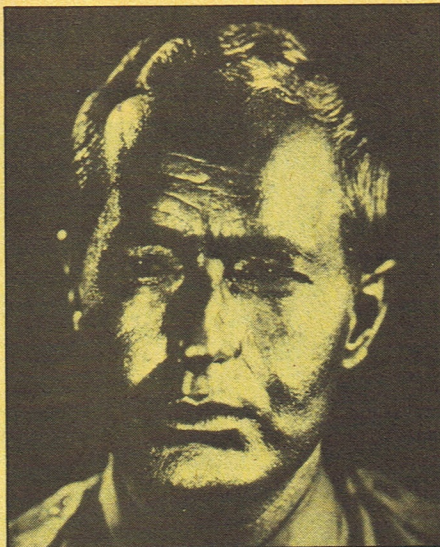

Melton is actually under the control of Frederick Cregar (Klemperer), agent of an unnamed foreign power, responsible for the unnatural occurrences.

### LONG LIVE THE KING

### THE SABOTEUR

### THE AMPHIBIANS

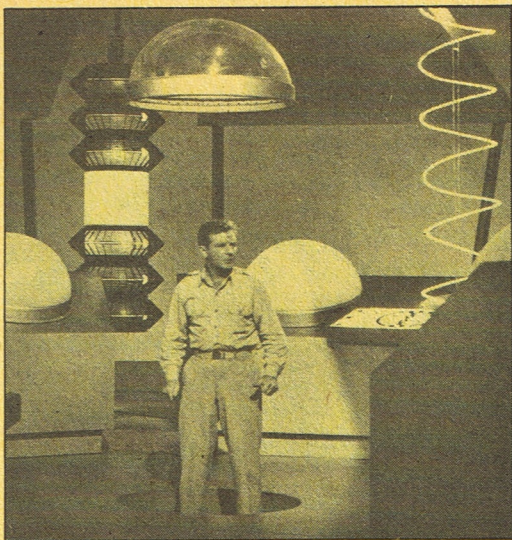

Nelson boards the yacht of exiled dictator Brynov (Asner) to receive vital information concerning an enemy plot. Using primitive navigation, Nelson must find SEAVIEW before they die of exposure.

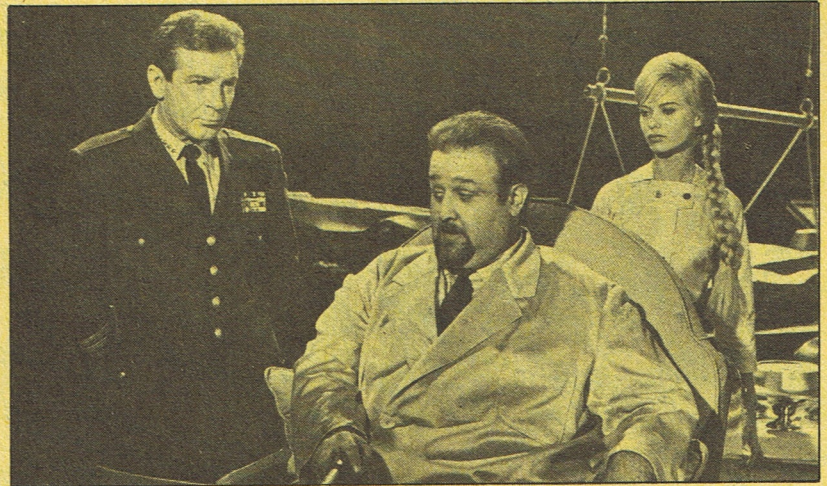
### THE CREATURE

## SECRET OF THE LOCH

Upon investigating, Nelson discovers that the "monster" is actually a disguised enemy sub, spying on a secret underwater lab, and that MacDougal is a double agent.

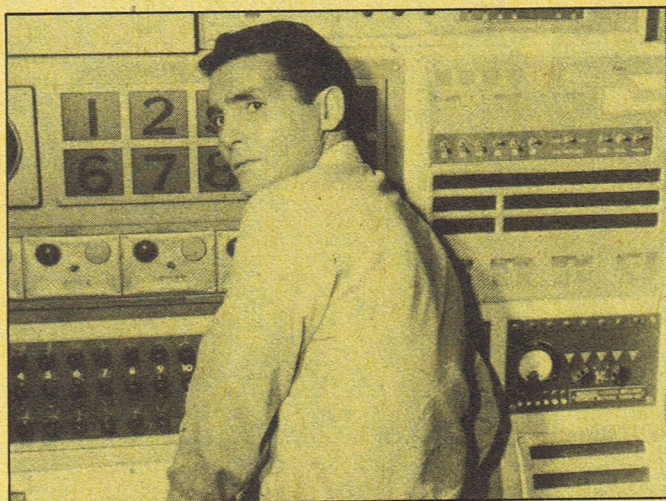

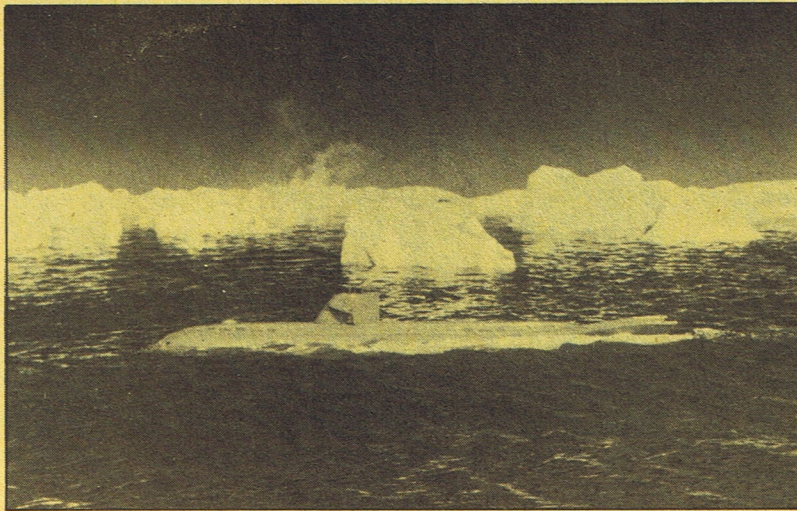
