1911 - 1962



WEE WILLIE WRITES AGAIN (TEN YEARS LATER)

Bill Harper, former Editor of the Buckskin Tab and Chief of Buckskin Lodge has consented to write for the Tab again. In this article he reviews the progress and the nature of Buckskin Lodge, Order of the Arrow over the last 10 years.

A decade ago the Buckskin Lodge was beginning to take its present form. It had been guided through the transition period from Buckskin Sons of Wauwe-pex to Order of the Arrow by Chief Bob Hayes who insured that the respect and dignity of the former group would be continued. Its ceremental work and the necessary costumes were being prepared under the skilled craftsmanship of Doug Mathewson. The organisational set-up was strengthened by Chief Henry Schneider's leadership.

As a means of communication, the TAB was published as a one-page news-letter. It was needed then for the lodge was mainly a camp affair. The elections, tapouts, and inductions gave us much summer work, but during the winter we were out of contact with the membership.

Changes came to Buckskin Lodge in the forms of home-unit elections, a revised set of rules and regulations, and greater committee work.

The home-unit elections were a part of the new emphasis by the National Scout Council on home leadership and activities. The revision work was necessary to handle the new procedures, and also to facilitate matters in an expanding Lodge

Crdeit for the excellent committee system goes to Chief Richard Schaefer. The success rests with the boys of the Lodge who cooperated so well in its support. This system gave work to many people and generated a feeling of unity. The vast achievements of the Lodge took place because many participated and in doing so became a part of and understood the Lodge operation.

A reservior of leadership was provided as the committee chairmen were observed in their handling of assignments by many people. They were recognized for their responsibility in lower levels.

The Lodge is unique in that it has a cohesiveness not often found in other societies in a Metropolitan area. It stays together. It appears uniform whenever it travels. Everyone knows a Buckskin in the Order of the Arrow.

With rare exceptions, its members are accepted and lauded by Scoutmasters. Its service has been great and lasting in one of the largest Councils in America. It doesn't deviate from the program of the National Lodge and the National Council; it cooperates to advance Scouting's goals.

It has a high caliber of boys who grow into leadership positions. One former chief has a doctorate degree, one is a Naval officer - Annapolis graduate, others include a teacher, a priest, a scout executive, and a county landscape engineer.

The Lodge was excellent then and is excellent now because it is built upon the foundation of the fine Nassau County Council - its professionals, its volunteers, and its boys.
