

# NOMINEES CHOSEN PETITIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

The Nominating Committee is composed of a Chairman and an Advisor chosen by the Lodge Chief, one representative from each district in Nassau County Council, a representative of the Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil members of the Lodge, and a few adult advisors. At the first meeting the committee suggested names of qualified Brothers. 

In the Spring of 1949 under the guidance of Richard A. Blauvelt, cur former Scout Executive, the Buckskin Sons of Wauwepex became the Buckskin Lodge #412 of the Order of the Arrow. Since then it has continued to increase in size and service as the growth of Nassau County has made demands upon it. In 1951 the Lodge established its first permanent ring site and published the first edition of the Buckskin Tab. 1953 marked the first year of home troop elections. In 1956 the Lodge established its first ring at the Onteora Scout Reservation. In 1960 our Lodge's Dance Team won first place. In 1962 the first issue of the "where to Go Camping" pamphlet was published with a great deal of success. Our history is full of many successful achievements too lengthy to list.

Meeting closed at 4:05 PM.




tee held a successful meeting at Harkness. The District Chairmen were there, as well as a few Brothers interested in serving on the committee this year.
