BUCKSKINS PLAN ACTIVE SUMMER on to . . .

Bucks skin Lodge is planning one of its most active summers at Onteora Scout Reservation and Camp Wauwepex this year. Over 325 Scouts, Explorers, and Scouters will be inducted into the Ordeal membership and about eighty Arrowmen will seal their vows in the Brotherhood.

Lodge Chief Paul Plate will coordinate Order activities at Onteora Scout Reservation this summer. Roy Geffen has been appointed as Acting Summer Lodge Chief for the 1967 season at Camp Wauwepex. At both camps, Lodge meetings will be held during the first week of each period for all Order members attending camp. Announcements concerning definite times and places will be made in the dining halls at camp.

Ordeal candidates will be tapped out on the Second Sunday evening of each period and the Pre-Ordeal will follow immediately. Tapouts will be held at individual program area campfires at Onteora and at the Visitors' Day campfire at Wauwepex. The Ordeal will be run on the second Sunday of each period at each camp and will be followed by the Ordeal ceremony on Monday evening.

Brotherhood tapouts are scheduled for the Visitors' Day campfires at both camps. Brotherhood ceremonies will be held during the second week of each period. Candidates for the Vigil Honor will be called out at a special ceremony at a Visitors' Day campfire during one period at each camp.

Brothers are reminded that only Ordeal candidates attending camp for two weeks will be permitted to take their Ordeal. All Brothers attending camp are urged to attend the Lodge meeting and act as a guide and taskmaster for the Ordeal during his period.

The conference will start on Monday, August 28 and will conclude on Friday, September 1. Bucks skin Lodge's delegation will leave Nassau County by train on August 26 and return on September 3.

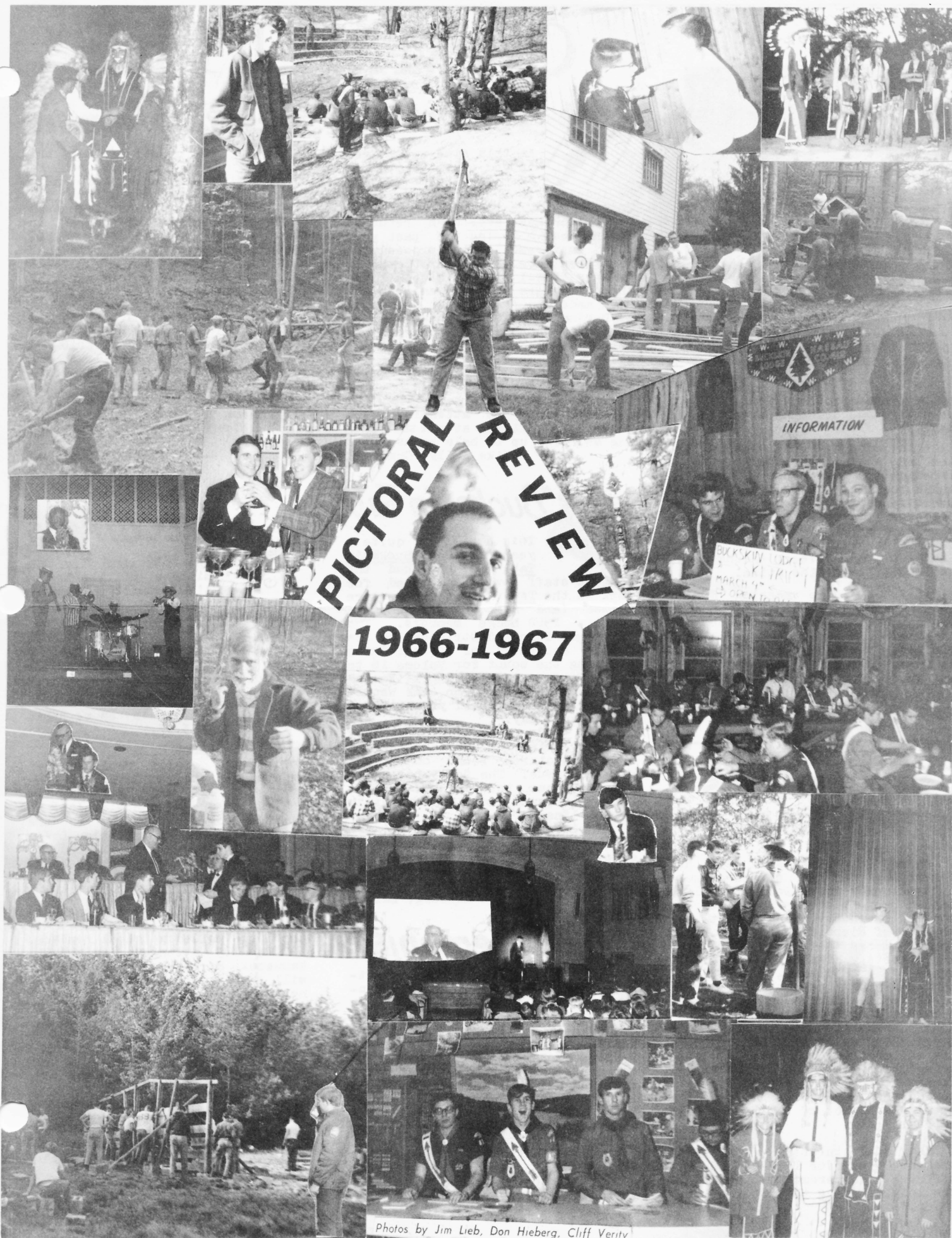

This has been quite a year for the Buckskin Tab. We have had the biggest staff ever assembled for work on the TAB. Nine issues were mailed (and most of them on time) to the 1500 Lodge members. The Cavalcade issue distributed to the public accounted for another issue bringing the count for Volume 16 to ten issues. A special "April Fools" TAB was distributed on the Wauwepex Weekend on (would you believe) April Fools Day.

Fifty reservations for Nat'l Conf. have been made for Buckskin Lodge. **MOTION** by Steve Brenner: "That \$60.00 be appropriated to Area and Nat'l Rel. Committee for expenses." Passed.

ORIENTATION--Charities Booklet was dropped because council already publishes one.

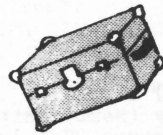

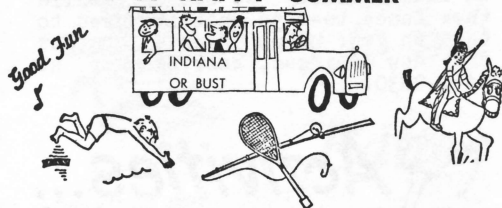
