# In Memoriam DICK HARPER

Lodge Chief 1957-1958

It is with deepest sorrow that the members of Buckskin Lodge learnwounded on January 31, 1968, while serving with the U.S. Army in the Siagon area, South Vietnam.

Dick began his Scouting career as a member of Troop 179, Baldwin, ultimately achieving the coveted rank of Eagle Scout. He subsequently joined Post 179, Baldwin, and accepted the leadership responsibilities of various post offices including the presidency. His most sincere, cheerful and unselfish service was clearly discerned by his fellow Scouts when they elected him into the membership of the Order of the Arrow. His continued leadership and service were partially reflected by his election as Lodge Chief September, 1957, and culminated in the awarding of the Vigil Honor in August, 1958 no - he - hon, his Indian name, translated as "energetic mah", was truly most appropriate.

Dick received his baccalaureate from Hofstra University and was a doctoral candidate at Harvard University at the time of his acceptance of his commission in the U.S. Armv.

The Lodge, with deepest sympathy, mourns the passing of a good an unselfish Brother, and a true humanitarian.

# Lodge Chief







# Little Lodge Chief




# **Corresponding Secretary**

# **Recording Secretary**



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


