Dear Brother,

For the past few months Arrowmen from the member Lodges of Area 2-J have been meeting to make plans for what we hope will be the most significant conference held in several years.

The results of this planning will be seen on the weekend of September 6-8, 1968, when the Area 2-J Training Conclave will be held at Camp Nauwepex on Long Island. Delegations from Lodges located in five boroughs of New York, Nassau and Suffolk counties, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands will meet to discuss common Lodge problems and to participate in training on several phases of Lodge operations.

Although training is an important part of the Conclave, it will not be the only part. Fun and fellowship also have a place in the program. An OA Olympics, demonstations of the Ordeal and Brotherhood ceremonies, and a competition in Indian dancing will be held. The waterfront will be open for swimming, and if possible we will have the use of the archery and skeet ranges. The informal "cracker barrel" sessions each evening will provide opportunities to meet with Brothers from other Lodges and trade patches or just relax.

The fee for the Conclave will be \$5.00 and will cover registration, all meals, and the special activities. A colorful patch will be given out at registration and is included in the Conclave fee. Your Lodge Chief (or a person whom he will designate) will be accepting reservations from the Brothers of your Lodge and arranging transportation to and from the Conclave. All reservations must be received by the Area before June 10 so that adequate provisions can be made for those who will attend.

### HOW TO APPLY FOR BROTHERHOOD

When a candidate first passes through his Ordeal ceremony and becomes an Arrowman, he takes upon himself certain vows (expressed primarily in the Obligation) to uphold the honor and traditions of the Order.

The purpose of the Brotherhood is to permit those Brothers who feel that they would like to continue this program of service to seal these vows through the Brotherhood ceremony.

The requirements for Brotherhood are set forth by the National Committee. If you have maintained your active registration in Scouting and the Order for at least 10 months, and if it is your steadfast purpose so to continue, you are eligable to seal your membership voluntarily by induction into the Brotherhood.

Ordeal members are tapped for Brotherhood at the four periods of Summer camp at both council camps, Onteora and Wauwepex (you must be registered for the full 2-week period to be inducted), on the 1968 fall weekends at Wauwepex and Onteora, and on the 1969 spring weekend at Wauwepex.

To apply for Brotherhood, you must submit a letter rededicating yourself to the principles of the Order, in addition to requesting Brotherhood membership. The letter, including your name, address, phone number, unit number and your position in the unit, district, and the date and place at which you could be inducted. Send your letter to:

It should be understood that Brotherhood membership is a matter of personal choice, and that the only screening is done by yourself. Before submitting your letter, it is advisable that you carefully go over your service record to Scouting and the Order. It should also be noted that anyone who meets the requirements for Brotherhood membership may apply, even if you do not receive a personal letter in the mail.
