### SUMMER SCORES!!

### Record Number Inducted at C.W and O.S.R.

The 1968 summer season scored the biggest success for Buckskin Lodge in its nineteen year history. At both Onteora Scout Reservation and Camp Wauwepex a total of eight hundred Scouts were inducted into our Order, bringing our registration to over twenty - two hundred Brothers. The ceremonies at both camps went exceptionally well, both Ordeal and Brotherhood included. Without a doubt, Brotherhood and Cheerful Service took a major step forward within the last two months under the direction of Don Heiberg, Lodge Chief, and Dennis Klein, Summer Lodge Chief at Wauwepex.

#### **WAUWEPEX**

Camp Wauwepex, enjoying its finest summer in several years, inducted a record 263 new Brothers. Camp Chief Dennis Klein received willing cooperation from the staff and campers, enabling him to run the Order's activities smoothly. The candidates completed every task asked of them. The major projects accomplished were the construction of Kniffen cabin, the conserving of the land about camp, the reparation of the roads, and the painting of the Health Lodge. This work and much more was directed and controlled by Head Taskmaster Tom Seremeta and his many assistants.

The Ordeal Team, under the direction of assistant Camp Chief Bruce MacAllister, deserves much praise. Dennis Klein was Allowat Sakima, Joe Bruno was Nutiket, and

### ONTEORA

During the past summer, 537 candidates were inducted into the Order of the Arrow at Onteora. The largest induction was held second period, with 165 inductees. The pre-ordeal followed the tapout, with new station locations for Allowat Sakima and Meteu.

# HUGE TURNOUT EXPECTED AT THE ONTEORA WEEKEND

The buses are scheduled to leave Harkness Training Center at 6:00 PM on September 20 for the long, anxious ride to the "Land in the Sky." Buckskin members will pay \$5.00 for the round trip, a savings of over \$3.00 from the estimated cost by car. (Checks may be made payable to "Buckskin Lodge #412, Order of the Arrow.")

the registration fee, \$2.00, which covers all meals and lodging. (No partial meal tickets can be purchased.) Friday night's program will also include an Ordeal and a Brotherhood Tapout.

If each member will bring a tool with him -- paintbrush, showel, axe, hammer, saw, etc. -- much more can be accomplished with relative ease and speed. Saturday will be climaxed by Ordeal and Brotherhood Ceremonies.


We are proud of the service we gave to the camp this past summer, and we thank the Brothers who unselfishly gave up their time for the Lodge.
