Bylaw Changes Approved

On Sunday morning, April 13, a general Lodge meeting took place at Camp Wauwepex's Frontier Dining Hall. In attendance were the two hundred eighty - four Brothers, both old and new, who were serving on the weekend. At this meeting a major Bylaw change was presented to the members for a vote.

The change, involving the Lodge year, had already been approved by the Buckskin Lodge Executive Committee at their April meeting held on March 30 at Harkness Training Center. By an overwhelming majority, the Bylaw alteration was accepted. Article VI, Section 1 now states that "the election for officers of the Lodge shall begin on or before April 2 and shall conclude on or before May 15." Article VI, Section 7, which was also changed, now reads that the "officers elect-

Wauwepex Weekend Is Best Yet

There is an old saying about "April Showers...," but there wasn't a cloud in the sky during the Spring Wauwepex Weekend. This annual event took place on April 11, 12, and 13, when Brothers and Candidates arrived at Camp Wauwepex for a weekend of Cheerful Service and Fellowship. Check - in began at 6:00 PM and

Check - in began at 6:00 PM and was handled as quickly as possible by the Help Committee under the guidance of Joe Bonadonna. A total of two - hundred fourty - eight (248) Brothers and thirty-six (36) Candidates attended. When they arrived, they found little to no check - in lines, which was unusual.

At 9:30 PM on Friday night there was an outdoor campfire at the Amphitheatre, with the O.A. Dance Team providing the entertainment. Roy Burnham deserves the credit for coordinating the physical arrangements. The Brotherhood Ceremonial Team made their entrance first, calling out thirteen Brothers to the Brotherhood. Thirty-six Scouts were then tapped for Ordeal Candidacy as the Ordeal Ceremonial Team made their impressive entrance. The candidates were afterwards led to the Pre-Ordeal sites to continue with the ceremonies. All the candidates were soon bedded down for the night, while Brothers enjoyed a late snack. Most of the Brothers got to sleep about midnight.

Guides and candidates woke up about 6:00 AM to a beautiful Saturday morning. All of them had checked in at the Amphitheatre by 6:45, after which the candidates had breakfast, eating "frugally." Breakfast for the Brothers followed, and everyone started to cheerfully serve about 8:30.

Camp Wauwepex benefited greatly by the work accomplished. Some of the service projects for the candi-

ed will officially take office on September 1 following election and will be ceremoniously installed on the Lodge's first Fall Fellowship Weekend after September 1 or at a time and place selected."

These changes were suggested by the Membership Expansion Evaluation Committee (as was stated in the April Tab). The committee felt that it was extremely difficult for an incoming chief to organize his committee structure in less than a month to efficiently and effectively run the summer camp operation. By changing the transfer of office to September 1, an administration will be able to plan for the summer operations on a committee basis and initiate their plans during the summer. More Lodge members, camp staff members, and campers would be able to become involved in the summer operations before the summer begins. By the time the new administration takes office, they will be familiar with the Lodge's operations and will be able to smoothly move into the fall weekends and committee activities.

Accordingly, the other Bylaw change was introduced to shift the election one month later as an early election will be unnecessary.

Hopefully, these changes will result in a more efficiently run Lodge in the future.

Election Results (cont.)

Three hundred and sixty-five ballots were received out of the eleven hundred sent out this year. This constitutes 33.2% of the eligible voters, showing a drop both in numbers and percentage over last year.

During the time administrations are serving their terms of office there are always a number of people who criticize them. Usually they are those who you see only once or twice a year, and who possibly have not paid their dues, with the consequence of not being able to cast their ballot. But people who are even worse are those who pay their dues, are eligible, but do not exercise their right. Only one-third of this year's eligible members sent in their ballots. In the March Tab and April Tab, there were reminders to vote, in addition to being reminded on the Wauwepex Weekend. Remember, it is up to you to choose your leaders. And in a close race, one vote can determine who wins or loses. Let me now quote what a past Lodge Chief once said, "...I sincerely hope, however, that the returns will improve in future years. I do not, on the other hand, want the elections to become gross political affairs. The officers are running for the betterment of the Lodge, and not for any personal a-chievement." This last statement is one of great importance to remember throughout this Lodge year, and others to come.

The officers - elect will officially take office on September 1 according to the recent Bylaw change.

Let all the Brothers now, along with the <u>Tab</u> staff and the present officers, congratulate next year's leaders on their election, and wish them the best, with our cooperation, in the coming year.

The Brotherhood affords him an

The Brotherhood affords him an opportunity to continue with a life of cheerful service to others and to strengthen those things that were taught in the Ordeal. These two elements make up the complete induction into membership and, after the Brotherhood Ceremony, the member becomes a "brother" in the Lodge.

The Ordeal consists primarily of physical impressions, new associations, and additional preparation. The Brotherhood Ceremony is one of deeper and quieter mental impressions for the member. The qualifications of Brotherhood membership are:

- 1 Ten months as an Ordeal member
- 2 Registered membership in Scouting
- 3 Registered membership in Buckskin Lodge
- 4 Satisfactory knowledge of the Brotherhood Questionnaire

The Brotherhood candidate must also submit a letter of redidication to the principles of the Order of the Arrow. This letter will be brought by him at the time of his induction.

Brotherhood is not to be thought of as a separate honor in the same sense as Ordeal membership. By sealing your vows you pledge to continue to serve your fellows cheerfully for the rest of your life. To seal one's vows is the most sacred of an Arrowman's duties, and thus, the decision must be your own.
