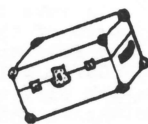

The Wauwepex Fall Weekend will be held on October 24-26, 1969. Deadline for registration is OCTOBER 18, 1969, and no late forms will be accepted.

The fees are not refundable.

Check-in will be from 7:30 to 8:30 pm at the Frontier Dining Hall on Friday evening, October 24. The weekend will conclude after lunch on Sunday, October 26, at about 1 pm.

The lodge does not provide bus transportation to Wauwepex. If you cannot secure your own transportation, the lodge will attempt to find a ride for you. If you have room in your car for additional people other than those you are already taking, the Inter-Relations Committee will fill the seats with riders from your own area.

Be sure to include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your payment or else your registration card will not be returned.

OSR SPECIAL INDUCTION

A Special Induction was held at the Onteora Scout Reservation during the closing-of-summer-camp weekend, August 21-22. Twenty-eight candidates were inducted during the inspiring induction.

The candidates reported to the Council House dining hall on Friday evening where they checked in and were given a snack. Kichkinet then led them through the moon-lit Pre-Ordeal. Kichkinet, the guide, with the help of Nutiket, placed the candidates for the night and then in the morning awoke them and they were instructed to cook their breakfasts.

During the day, as the 900 fourth period Scouts were leaving Onteora, the Ordeal sheepskins worked with the Onteora staff in closing of camp for the winter. By the end of the day, all of the 650 tents and the 1300 mattresses had been placed in storage for the winter and all the bunks were stacked in each patrol area.
