- 1. If you are an Explorer, you need not advance a rank.
- 2. If you are over 18, you need not complete a council approved training course.
- The requirement of bringing a new boy or adult into Scouting has been redefined. It is not necessary that the boy or adult be new to Scouting. He may have been in Cubbing and brought into a Troop, or in a Troop and brought into a Post. or may have been brought into a new Troop, etc. He may be entirely new to or rejoining Scouting.

The committee has come up with the actual award. It is a beautiful fully embroided patch that is attached to a certificate. patch can be removed to show a picture of the patch underneath.

Banquet Tickets

- If you would like to sit with a specific group of Brothers select one Brother to serve as your ticket chairman. He will order all the tickets for your group.
- 3. Tables will seat a maximum of ten (10) Brothers. If your group is larger than ten, indicate how you would like it divided. (ex. If there are 12 in your group, indicate which Brothers you want together, 7 at one table, 5 at another; 6 and 6; 10 and 2; etc.)
- 4, Requests for tickets will not be honored unless the name of <u>each</u> Brother is spelled out.
- Brothers submitting individual requests for tickets cannot be seated with Brothers of their choice.
- 6. Tickets cost \$5.00 each. Be sure to remit the entire amount for your delegation with one check if possible. All checks and money orders should be made payable to: "Buckskin Lodge #412, Order of the Arrow." DO NOT SEND CASH!
- 7. Be sure to enclose a stamped envelope addressed to your ticket chairman who will receive all the tickets for your delegation.

** Wauwepex Weekend Windup **

A true Brotherhood of Cheerful Service abounded at the Wauwepex Service Weekend on October 25-27. A total of 277 Brothers and 102 candidates attended. Check-in was orderly and everyone was registered by 9:00. The Brotherhood Tap started at 9:45. The Brotherhood Tapout team consisted of Tom Reinhart as Allowat Sakima, John Citera as Meteu, Gary

Wildung as Kichkinet, and Bob Schlanger as Nutiket. There were two Ordeal tapouts. The Ordeal tapouts were conducted by the Brotherhood team and also by Carlos Kebe as Allowat Sakima, Joe Bruno as Meteu, Joe Bonadonna as Nutiket, and Larry Starr as Kichkinet.

Much work was accomplished on the weekend. Patrol tables were repaired; the fire trail was cleared; the mattresses, cots, and tents were stored for the winter; conservation projects around the camp were started; florescent lights were put in the Indian dining hall kitchen; the Buckskin Memorial Gateway at the amphitheater was varnished; and records of the recording secretary were worked on.

Twenty-five Brothers sealed their vows in the Brotherhood. The Brotherhood ceremonial team consisted of Gabe Gluck as Allowat Sakima, Gary Wildung as Meteu, Frank Ostaseski as Kichkinet, and Bob Schlanger as Nutiket.

At the Ordeal Ceremony, Carlos Kebe was Allowat Sakima, Joe Bruno was Meteu, Joe Bonadonna played Nutiket, and Larry Starr played Kichkinet.

A delicious feed followed the ceremonies. Afterwards the Lodge was fortunate enough in seeing the Academy Award winning movie "The Attack of the Black Scorpion."

At 9:00 PM, EDT, Friday night we switched to "Wauwepex Standard Time." This was done by moving the clock back one day early to avoid the confusion on Sunday morning. The weather was favorable over the weekend. The cold air that swept the camp Friday and Saturday nights (it was 27° Sunday morning) did not cause any problems as everyone was prepared with extra blankets and clothing.

Honor The Outstanding

What Buckskin Brother is doing an outstanding job as an Arrowman in the Lodge, Scouting, or the Community? Do you feel he should be highly honored by the Lodge? The person you have in mind could well deserve the Vigil Honor-the highest honor a Lodge can bestow upon one of its members.

In the selection of Vigil Honor candidates the Vigil Honor Committee relies heavily on nominations from you, the individual Lodge member. You DO NOT have to be a Vigil Honor member to make a nomination and you can nominate as many Brothers as you deem worthy. Nominator names are kept confidential within the Vigil Honor Committee.

To make your nomination, call or write the Vigil Chairman and request a Vigil Honor nomination form. When you receive it fill it out as completely as possible and return it BEFORE FEBRUARY 28, 1970. It is impossible for the Vigil Honor Committee to consider any nomination received after Feb. 28, 1970.

The basic requirements for the Vigil Honor are that the Brother have been a Brotherhood member for a minimum of two years when he is selected by the Vigil Committee (which means he must have sealed his vows prior to May 1, 1968) and he must be actively registered in Scouting and in Buckskin Lodge for 1970. Both boy and adult members may be nominated or may make nominations. If you are not sure a Brother meets these minimum requirements (you may not be sure of his date of Brotherhood) submit his name to the Vigil Chairman and his eligibility will be determined from the Lodge records.
