## Welcome to GEORGE C. SMALLING, Lodge Lay Advisor

Scout Executive James M. Davenport, Jr., recently announced the appointment of Mr. George C. Smalling as the Buckskin Lodge Lay Advisor. Mr. Smalling will work with the Staff Advisor, Mr. Joseph DeCanio, in an advisory capacity to the Lodge Chief and officers in their administration of Lodge policy and activities.

Mr. Smalling was inducted into the Buckskin Sons of Wauwepex in 1947 and became one of the original Buckskin Lodge Ordeal members when we became an Order of the Arrow Lodge in 1949. He received his Brotherhood in 1950. In August, 1955, he was called to the Vigil Honor and was named "Wawokiye" which is translated "One Who Helps All."

## District Representatives:

The following constitutes the responsibilities of your District Representative:

1. The District Representative will work with the Inter-relations chairman, performing the duties of the Inter-relations committee on a district level. Essentially, he will coordinate the activities of the Lodge within his dixtrict.

2. He will attend the Roundtable meetings of his particular district. At these meetings, he will answer any questions pertaining to the 0.A. that may arise. He should make himself known to the professional scouters and scoutmasters so they can easily call on him.

3. He will submit the activities of his district to the <u>TAB</u> editor for printing in a special column of District 1-6 Activities. Any district activity announced (such as a neighborhood service project, etc.) can be attended by <u>ANY</u> member of the Lodge.

4. He will serve as the O.A. representative for all the troops in his district, answering questions and directing inquiries through the proper channels.

In order to facilitate his responsibilities, an O.A. representative in each home troop would be responsible to the District representative. The troop representative would promote the O.A. in his own troop.
