CAMP WAUWEPEX

NASSAU COUNTY COUNCIL'S LONG ISLAND CAMP



This beautiful Long Island Camp of the Nassau County Council is located near the village of Wading River in Suffolk County. It provides the finest facilities for an unexcelled Scout Camping program. Facilities include swimming and boating areas, modern dining halls, Craft Lodge, Rifle Range, Trading Post, Nature and Field Sports areas.

CAMP FEES

Wauwepex provides two types of camping. Members of their own Troop, camping under their own adult leadership, pay a total fee of \$46.00 per period. \$5.00 of this fee is payable as a registration fee before April 1, 1966. (Registration fee not refundable.)

Scouts may attend camp on an individual basis, camping under leadership supplied by the camp, at a total fee of \$55.00 per period. \$10.00 of this fee is payable as a registration fee and is non-refundable in the event of cancellation.

General Camp Information - Both Camps

Visitors at Camp - Visitors are welcome at camp only on the following designated dates:

Camp Wauwepex - Middle Sunday of each period 2-10 P.M.
Onteora Scout Reservation - Middle Saturday of each period 10 A.M. - 10 P.M.

Health & Safety - Each camper must present a Health examination form from his own physician to enter camp. A well equipped Health Lodge is maintained and staffed by qualified personnel at each camp. Campers are covered by a Medical Reimbursement Policy as a part of their camping fee.

Cancellations & Refunds - Refund of camp fees (exclusive of registration deposit) will be made only by written cancellation to the Council Office at least two weeks prior to the opening of the camp period.

What to Take to Camp - Scouts attending either Wauwepex or Onteora should take the following to camp:

Onteora offers two types of Canoe Trips for Scouts and Explorers over 14 years of age. Lake canoeing on the Fulton Chain in the Adirondacks, and White Water Canoeing on the Delaware.

Onteora Scout Reservation, located at Livingston Manor, New York, offers 2400 acres of unexcelled camping area in the Catskill Mountains. The program at Onteora is Troop and Patrol centered, and especially designed to strengthen the Troop and its Patrols. Program highlights include aquatics, horseback riding, hiking, outpost camping, fishing, field sports and counseling in all outdoor merit badges.

1966 CAMP PERIODS

- 1st Period - July 2 - July 16
- 2nd Period - July 16 - July 30
- 3rd Period - July 30 - Aug. 13
- 4th Period - Aug. 13 - Aug. 27

Camp fees at Onteora are based upon food service plan desired by each Troop.

- Plan I** - all food furnished and prepared by Troop - \$14.00 per Scout per period.
- Plan II** - Camp furnishes 1 meal per day - \$30.00 per Scout per period.
- Plan III** - Camp furnishes 2 meals per day - \$41.00 per Scout per period.

All Units cook at least one meal per day.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS AT ONTEORA

CAMP STAFF TRAINING - a program designed to assist Explorers and Scouts over 14 years in preparing for camp staff positions, at either Onteora or Wauwepex. This program offered two periods only - July 2 - July 16; July 16 - July 30. Fee \$52.00. Registrations accepted on a first come basis by filing application blank and payment of \$10.00 deposit.

CANOE TRIPS - Adirondack Fulton Chain Canoe Trips are conducted during each of the regular periods at Onteora. Total fee of \$62.00 per period covers all costs. Each trip is limited to 18 participants. Application may be made by filing application and payment of \$10.00 reservation fee.

Delaware River Canoe Trips are conducted during the third and fourth periods only - July 30 - Aug. 13; Aug. 13 - Aug. 27. Total fee - \$62.00. Registration procedure same as for Adirondack Canoe Trips.

Bus transportation is available for all programs at Onteora. Make arrangement with Schenck Transportation Company - FL 4-1600.



A two week Junior Leader Training Program is conducted each period at Onteora. This program is an intensive training in the most approved methods of Troop operation, and does not permit time for participation in many of the usual camp programs, or the earning of Merit Badges. Registration for this program is limited to Scouts 12 years of age or older and at least second class Scouts. Fee of \$50.00 covers entire cost, including recognition presented upon satisfactory completion of the course. Registration for this program may be made by filing application blank and payment of \$10.00 deposit (non-refundable in the event of cancellation) at the Council Office. Space is limited and registrations will be accepted on a first come basis.
