ONTEORA SCOUT RESERVATION IN THE CATSKILLS — "LAND IN THE SKY"

1971 CAMP PERIODS

First Period July 3 - July 17 Third Period July 31 - Aug. 14 Second Period July 17 - July 31 Fourth Period Aug. 14 - Aug. 28 Periods start with the evening meal on opening Saturday and end with lunch on the closing Saturday.

HOME TROOP PLANS AND FEES*

Plan 1 - \$22.00 (Discounted \$18.00) per Scout per period. Unit furnishes and prepares all meals.

Plan 2 - \$42.00 (Discounted \$38.00) per Scout per period. Camp furnishes one prepared meal per day.

Plan 3 - \$52.00 (Discounted \$48.00) per Scout per period. Camp furnishes two prepared meals per day. Unit furnishes one meal per day (usually Breakfast.)

Buckskin Plan - \$52.00 (Discounted \$48.00) per Scout per period. Camp provides unit with all food (3 meals per day) but unit does all its own cooking and cleanup. Each patrol is provided with a sheepherder stove, food box, cook kit, cooking utensils, and cleanup materials.

All plans include full participation in the camp program.

All payments must be made to the Troop. Units may charge additional fees for equipment, transportation, additional meals, etc. Our Troop will be camping at Onteora during period

VISITORS AT CAMP — Visitors are welcome at Onteora on the middle Saturday of each period between the hours of 10 AM and 10 PM only.



DIRECTIONS — Onteora is located in northern Sullivan County. It may be reached by taking New York 17 to Livingston Manor (Exit 96). Make a left, follow DeBruce Rd. for 2.1 miles. Make left on Grooville Rd. - 4.3 miles to camp.

CAMP WAUWEPEX ON EASTERN LONG ISLAND — "DEEP WATER"

Located on a beautiful fresh water lake, near the village of Wading River, Long Island, this camp provides facilities for great Scout Camping.

1971 CAMP PERIODS

First Period July 4 - July 17 Third Period Aug. 1 - Aug. 14 Second Period July 18 - July 31 Fourth Period Aug. 15 - Aug. 28 Camp periods open with the evening meal on Sunday evening of each period and close following breakfast on the closing Saturday. CAMP FEES*

HOME TROOP CAMPING, under leadership provided by the unit -\$60.00 (Discounted \$56.00) per Scout per Period. All meals are provided by the camp. Kosher Feeding is available during first period only. All payments are to be made to the troop. Unit may charge additional fees for equipment, etc. Our troop will camp at Wauwepex during period . Total Fee \$

INDIVIDUAL CAMPING - Individual Scouts may attend Wauwepex where they will become a part of a "Provisional Troop." Camp Fee is \$72.00 (\$68.00 if paid in full by June 15.) per Scout per period. Scouts should submit application and \$10.00 non-refundable deposit to the Council Office for each period which they are attending. Balance of fee is due 2 weeks prior to the begin-

ning of the period.

VISITORS AT CAMP — Visitors are welcome at Wauwepex on the middle Sunday of each period from 10 AM to 10 PM.

MAIL should be addressed giving the Scout's name, home troop number, and campsite to Camp Wauwepex, Wading River, NY 11792.

DIRECTIONS — Wauwepex is located in eastern Suffolk County. It may be reached by taking New York 495 (Long Island Expressway) East to Exit 68 North. Take William Floyd Pkwy. North for 4 miles then New York 25 East for 3 miles. Make left (North) at light on Wading River to Manor Road. 1.5 miles to camp on right.

* - All Home Troop Camp Reservations must be verified as to number of Scouts attending by filing of individual yellow application card and \$5.00 deposit per Scout per Week (\$10.00 per Scout for full period) for each Scout on or before April 1, 1971. (Reservation fee is not refundable but is transferable to a new choicant.) To take advantage of discounted fee, full payment must be made by June 15, 1971.

ONTEORA SPECIAL PROGRAMS

JUNIOR LEADER TRAINING - The JLT program, operated each period, is an intensive training in the method of teaching Scout skills and in Troop management. The rigorous program, demanded by the small amount of time available, does not permit earning of Merit Badges or participation in the usual camp activities. Registration is limited to regular Junior Leaders in the Troop, 12 years of age and older, and of at least second class rank. It is recommended that only those Junior Leaders who have clearly evidenced leadership ability in the Troop attend. Camp Fee - \$72.00 (\$68.00 if paid by 15.) June

CAMP STAFF TRAINING is designed to assist Explorers and Senior Scouts in qualifying for Camp Staff positions. Conducted first period only. Camp Fee - \$72.00 (\$68.00

if paid by June 15.)

CANOE TRIPS — Two types of canoe trips are operated from Onteora, using the camp as a training and outfitting base. Trips are conducted each period on the lakes of the Adirondacks. Advanced white water canoeing is conducted on the Delaware River during periods 2, 3, and 4 only. Minimum age is 14. Canoe Trip Camp Fee -\$85.00 (\$81.00 if paid by June 15.)

SPECIAL PROGRAM REGISTRATION PROCEDURE — Scouts attending a special program must submit to the Council Office an orange special program application along with a \$10.00 non-refundable (but transferable to a new applicant) registration fee for each program in which he is enrolling. Registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis. The balance of the fee must be paid at least 2 weeks prior to the start of the period. To take advantage of the discounted fee, full payment must be made by June 15, 1971.

CAMP WAUWEPEX AND ONTEORA

General Camp Information

Nassau County Council camps offer two basic types of camping plus special training programs and high adventure programs for older Scouts.

TROOP CAMPING — Most Scouts attend camp as members of their own Troops and under the leadership of the Troop. All Scouts attend Onteora under this plan, except those participating in one of the special programs. Many of the Scouts attend Camp Wauwepex as a member of their own Troop. Troop camping offers the finest campina experience, for each individual Scout, as well as in strengthening the troop organization and operation.

INDIVIDUAL CAMPING — Scouts may attend Camp Wauwepex as individual campers and will become part of a "Provisional Troop" at camp. At Onteora, Scouts may attend a special program.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS Refund of Camp Fee (exclusive of registration deposit) will be made only by written cancellation to the Council Office prior to the start of the camp period. Scouts medically excused from camp by the Camp Nurse or Camp Doctor will be issued refunds for the unused portion of the fee (exclusive of deposit.) ENTERING AND LEAVING CAMP — All Scouts and Leaders MUST check in or out at the Camp Office as they enter or leave camp. Scouts are not permitted to leave camp on visitors' day unless they have been checked out to go home.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES — Resident chaplains at each camp conduct services and are available for guidance and consultation throughout the camping season.

HEALTH AND SAFETY — Nassau County Camps operate under New York State Health Dept. regulations. Each camp has a fine, well equipped Health Lodge, staffed by a qualified nurse and supervised by the Camp Doctor. Every camper must present a Health Examination Form from his own physician to enter camp. Campers are covered by Medical Reimbursement policy as a part of their camping fee.

WHAT TO TAKE TO CAMP — Scouts should take

the following to camp:

Remember, it is always cooler at camp than in town, especially at night. Also, be sure to be prepared for wet weather.
