

## C. S. Brown Dies, L. I. Scout Head

### Services Are Held For Nassau Attorney Who Was Nassau Chief

Baldwin, Aug. 7—Funeral services were held yesterday for Carl Stedman Brown, attorney and for the last 15 years president of the Nassau County Council of the Boy Scouts of America, who died suddenly Friday of a heart attack in his home, 19 Rockwood Ave., here. He was 63.

The services were conducted in the Fulton Funeral Home in Freeport by Mrs. Louise Karpen of the Christian Science Church in Baldwin.

Mr. Brown, whose law office was in Mineola, was chairman of the Hempstead Planning Board, a member of the Hempstead Town Zoning Board of Appeals, and a director of the Nassau County Bar Association. Active in politics, he was a past president of the Baldwin Republican Club and a member of the Speakers Bureau of the Republican party at Mineola.

In 1926 Mr. Brown organized a campaign through which \$180,000 was obtained to purchase a 600-acre tract of land from the late Harry Payne Whitney and William K. Vanderbilt at Wading River. Camp Wauwepex was established for the Boy Scouts on this site.

Born in Plainfield, N. J., Mr. Brown was graduated from the New York University Law School and was admitted to the bar in 1902. Before coming to Baldwin about 20 years ago he had lived in Manhattan and for a number of years in Brooklyn. He was a past master of Benevolent Lodge 28, F. & A. M., in Manhattan.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Marion Henderson Brown, and a daughter, Mrs. Marion Rowley of Spotswood, N. J.
