

PLAN INDIAN VILLAGE FOR NASSAU SCOUTS

Wading River Camp to Accommodate 325 Boys.

Mineola, May 10.—Plans for enlarging facilities at Camp Wauwepex, near Wading River, were laid at a quarterly dinner and meeting of the Nassau County Council of the Boy Scouts at the Court View Hotel Friday night. Carl Stedman Brown, president of the council, presided. The council plans to add an Indian village for training of first class scouts of 14 years and over.

It was explained that this unit will provide accommodations for 16 boys at one time during the summer and 325 boys will be accommodated for periods of from one to two weeks. By this method it is stated 98 troops will be taken care of during the season.

The Sea Scout committee discussed the possibility of chartering the Theresa White, a training ship, for a cruise through the Great South Bay during the week of Aug. 24. An able captain will be engaged for the cruise. Franklin Remington, of Centre Island, will direct the trip.
