

NASSAU SCOUTS AT CAMP WAUWEPEX

The camp, which opened on July 7, has its full quota and all of the reservations have been filled for the balance of the season. Plans are under way to increase the quota next year.

The camp contains 600 acres of rolling woodland, which surrounds a lake of 40 acres, one of the finest

on Long Island. The water is clear as crystal, with a beach of white sand and pebbles.

The boys live in tents limited to six Scouts each. Administration buildings include a large dining hall, kitchen, museum, workshop and pumping station. Secretary Covey is executive head of the camp and spends much of his time there. His assistant is Hazen A. Ross, who makes his headquarters at the camp.

William H. Kniffin, vice-president and manager of the Bank of Rockville Centre, is the director of finance, whose plans resulted in the purchase of the camp two years ago and its maintenance.
