

BOY SCOUTS TO MEET

Nassau Executives to Gather at Glen Cove June 14.

Glen Cove, June 7. — Boy Scout executives of Nassau County will gather at Glen Cove Thursday evening, June 14, for the final monthly meeting and dinner prior to the summer recess. Delegations from every part of the country where Boy Scout work is being carried on will be present. They will be entertained by District 7 Council of Nassau County, with headquarters in this city, at the First Presbyterian Church of Glen Cove. The women of that church will prepare the dinner.

Throughout Nassau County there the increased Boy Scout activities, and reports of these will be made. There are now 1,400 scouts in the county. The annual financial drive for funds to maintain the county work for the coming year opens June 11, and will continue one week. The budget to be raised is \$18,000. Camp Wau-we-pex, the county Boy Scout camp, opens at Wading River early in July. District 7, Boy Scout Council, of this city, will have a camp at Bayville this summer. The scout-masters' training course, held at Hempstead during the winter, has proved so successful it is likely its continuance will be authorized at the meeting next week. During the past winter monthly meetings and dinners have been held at Rockville Centre, Hempstead, Glen Cove, Seaford and Mineola.

Thomas E. Hartman, of Rockville Centre, is president of the Nassau County Council of Boy Scouts. Howard F. Cocey is county executive, and I. F. Southworth is assistant executive of the county.
