

Bloodhounds Aid Search for Lost Boy Scout

Hundreds of persons and two state police bloodhounds were searching the lonely country around Lake Wauwepex, near Wading River, L. I., last night for a 14-year-old Boy Scout who disappeared Saturday from a Scout camp on the shore of the lake.

The youngster, William G. Lipsey Jr., of 8 Westbury Road, Garden City, L.I., was last seen walking along a much-used trail from one part of the camp to another. He was wearing his Scout uniform.

Camp Neighbors Join Hunt.

At first it was thought that the boy might have become homesick and returned to his home. When he failed to show up there, state and local police were notified early yesterday.

Local residents joined with the police in searching for the boy. Two bloodhounds were taken to the scene from Hawthorne Barracks, Hawthorne, N. Y.

The boy's father, a certified public accountant, said that his son could not have had any money, since he had spent his weekly allowance of \$1, and had written home for another dollar.

The youngster had been at the camp for one month and was to remain two more weeks.
