

Nassau Scouts Vision Record 1961 Training

A record summer training season for Nassau County Boy Scouts was forecast yesterday by S. Benjamin Barley of Great Neck, chairman of the county council's camp committee.

Already, 67% of the troops in Nassau have registered for two-week periods at the two council camps.

The 265 troops now enrolled, Barley said, will have a total of 7,000 scouts, or 15% more than the number that took part in the program last year.

Of these, 133 troops are enrolled at Camp Wauwepex, the 600-acre camp at Wading River, and 132 at Onteora Scout Reservation, a 2,400-acre site at Livingston Manor.

The Onteora camping facilities have been expanded so as to accommodate 1,000 scouts a week, according to Barley. By 1965, the enrollment is expected to reach 2,400 a week.
