

## *Scouts to Sell Roslyn Acres To Pay Debt*

Roslyn—To pay off a million-dollar debt, the Nassau County Council of the Boy Scouts of America has decided to sell 26.4 acres of its Harkness Training Center property here.

"We've sent out letters to about 20 real estate brokers and developers," Harold D. Shapiro, chairman of the council's properties committee, said. A local real-estate broker described the land, at the southeast corner of I.U. Willets and Shelter Rock Roads as "prime residential." Approximately 4.6 acres of the 30-acre property, where the council's executive offices are located, will be retained, Charles H. Greenman, a scouting executive, said.

The Council decided to sell the Harkness site after opposition developed to a plan to sell Camp Wauwepex, a 550-acre property in Wading River.

"We're in the hole for over \$900,000," said Joseph Munisteri, a Levittown scoutmaster. "It's better than selling our camp."
