In speaking on the subject, "You Never Can Tell," Kniffin cited incidents in the lives of such men as Lincoln, Coolidge, Al Smith, Franklin D. Roosevelt and Hitler which changed the course of history.

"I am not preaching temperance but I am interested in whom one meets and whether good or bad comes from that meeting," said Kniffin. "I am interested in incidents that lead upwards or down-

wards and whether casual meetings will make or break one.

"Looking from my height in years and experience at boys who are just starting out, my advice is always to take care of little things or you may never have an opportunity to know big events."
