

Camp Wauwepex Curriculum Announced

Wading River—Campcraft and water skills will be emphasized in the outdoor program of Camp Wauwepex, the Nassau County Boy Scout Camp which opened its summer season last Saturday. Current plans call for every boy to receive instruction in boat handling, canoeing and the establishing of a safe waterfront on hikes as well as the conventional classes in swimming and lifesaving. Craft classes will stress the making of equipment useful in camping.

A show a week is planned by the dramatic and music departments and the scouting museum plans to teach nature craft which they can use on camping trips.

Before the camp opened, junior leaders were given an intensive training course in methods of scouting and camp craft. The seven scouts who completed the course under the direction of Irving F. Southworth, assistant camp
