CAMP OPEN—Camp Wauwepex, Wading River, all-year camp of the Nassau County Council Boy Scouts, opened Saturday, the Fourth of July, for the 16th consecutive season. The camp during the last 15 years has witnessed remarkable strides forward in both accommodations for the Scouts of the council and in facilities for carrying out the various phases of the Scouting program.

This year a new pier extends 60 feet out into Deer Pond, the first two of eight proposed cabins for troop camping have been built and a rifle range has been developed.

Again the camp will be under the direction of Chief F. Howard Covey, council executive, with Troop Service Director Irving F. Southworth as assistant. "Southy" is in charge of the rifle range. Leaders of the two units are Ed Denning of Lynbrook and Jeurdan Sykes of Bellmore. Division leaders are Rodman Reilly of Mineola, Robert Higgs of Lynbrook, Eugene DeClue of Hempstead and Jack Rogers of Mineola. Sea Scout Ship Albatross will be skippered by Wray Landon of Great Neck, assisted by Mate William Travis of Great Neck.

Furman Stanley of Rickville Centre has charge of the waterfront as chief lifeguard. His assistants are Sid Hogerton of Garden City, David Lord of Port Washington and Bill Cooks of Garden City. For the tenth season Lou Felter of Orlando, Fla., is in charge of the craft lodge. Assisting in instructing the boys to make articles of leather wood and metal will be Joseph Stal of Lawrence, John Wolf and Edward Hoffman of Woodmere and Jack Van Name of Port Washington. Camp officially opens for the season with mess tonight.
