### Campaign Starts June 11.

The campaign will run from June 11 to 21. Headquarters have been established in the Lawyers Building, Mineola.

Scout work in Nassau County faces an emergency. Since the organization of the county council nine years ago the work has progressed as fast as the available leadership and facilities could handle it. There are now about 2,500 Boy Scouts in the county. For the past six years the summer camp has been held at Wading River, on a rented site. Now that land is on the market for sale, Nassau County Council has secured an option on the property at a price just half the figure offered for it by realtors.

### Find Only One Site.

A thorough investigation by a committee of the board of directors and by several Scoutmasters has failed to discover another site on Long Island that meets the requirements of Scout work and that will insure the future of Scouting in the county. Scores of letters from the boys and a petition circulated by them beg for Camp Wauwepex as a permanent Scout camp. At the present rate of growth, Scout leaders point out, it will not be many years before all of Nassau County will become one big city and without a camp the Scouting program will be reduced and Scouting will eventually be crowded out. The appeal, they declare, is to save Scouting for the boys present and future, of Nassau County.
