

4 of De Clue Brothers Are Now Eagle Scouts

**With Elevation of George, 16, Family Equals
Trinkhaus' Mark by Having Quartet
of Sons in High Post**

Hempstead, Aug. 20—The De Clue family of Hempstead has equalled the accomplishment of the Trinkaus family of Rockville Centre by being one of the two families in the United States of which four sons of each have attained the highest rank in the Boy Scouts—that of Eagle Scouts.

George Edward De Clue, 16, youngest of the brothers, whose home here is at 68 Lincoln Boulevard, was the central figure a few nights ago when at Camp Wauwepex, Nassau Scouts' Summer encampment, with several hundred fellow Scouts gathered about the great campfire, Carl Stedman Brown, president of the Nassau County Council, bestowed on him the insignia of Eagle Scout.

In 1927 Albert N. De Clue entered a compact with his two eldest sons, declaring that he would purchase an expensive wrist watch for the first one to qualify as an Eagle Scout.

Three years later the two boys appeared at the same Court of Honor in Hempstead and together received their Eagle Scout ranking. Mr. De Clue presented watches to both sons.

The first family of Eagle Scouts, that of the Trinkaus brothers, sons of Charles E. Trinkaus, lives at 136 Brower Ave., Rockville Centre.

The De Clue brothers holding this high rank are Dr. B. Leslie De Clue, 25; Albert S., 23; Eugene F., 21, and

now George E., who is an honor student at Hempstead High School. He is senior patrol leader of Scout Troop 72 of Hempstead.

The eldest brother, Dr. De Clue, is now chairman of the Court of Honor of the Nassau County Council. He is a dentist, maintaining offices in Hempstead. He attended Colgate University for two years and Harvard Dental School for four years. He is an officer of the Nassau County Dental Association, former grand master of the Mu Delta Chapter of the Psi Omega fraternity, which is the national dental fraternity at Harvard University. He is also a member of the Hempstead Lions Club.

Albert at Columbia

Albert S. is the present unit director of Camp Wauwepex. He is a graduate of Colgate University and has completed his first year at Columbia Law School. He was editor-in-chief of the Colgate Maroon, was a track man, member of the Senior Honor Society and secretary of the Student Association. Albert also is a member of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity.

Eugene F. has just completed his junior year at Colgate University and is a member of Phi Delta Theta fraternity. He has been attending Camp Wauwepex for the past nine years and now is camp secretary. He is assistant scoutmaster of Troop 72.

The four brothers live with their parents.
