

## Scout Campaign Concludes Today

### Final Report Dinner to Be Held at Garden City in \$51,854 Nassau Drive

Mineola, June 4—Encouraged by messages from leaders in Long Island life, 900 campaign workers in the fund drive of the Nassau County Council, Boy Scouts of America, went into the "last big push" toward their \$51,854 goal this week. The campaign is scheduled to end tomorrow with a final report dinner at the Garden City Hotel.

Well on the way to accomplishing their goal, with 13 regional chairmen supervising their lieutenants throughout the county, the workers heard a rallying call to "develop the selfish motive of taking part in Scouting" by William H. Kniffin of Rockville Centre, treasurer for the past eight years of the Nassau Council.

Another view of the benefits of Scouting was expressed at a recent report dinner by Dr. William A. Gore, superintendent of schools at Hempstead, who pointed out that the "be prepared" slogan of the Scouts places them at an advantage at a later life.

Increasing and improving the facilities of Camp Wauwepex, the year-round camping center for the Scouts, is one of the chief objects of the drive. F. Howard Covey, executive secretary of the Nassau Council, pointed out. The camp opens for Summer activities on July 9, he said, and guests are welcome to see Scout work at first hand.
