

Scouts of Nassau Rehearse Pageant

Story of Indian Romance
to Be Staged by Boys of
Camp Wauwepex Sunday

Wading River, Aug. 9—Camp Wauwepex is the scene of much Boy Scout activity in preparation for the camp's third annual Indian pageant, to be held Sunday evening on the shores of Deer Lake. This year's pageant will tell the romantic story of Wachita, white girl adopted by Indians.

Sunday is to be celebrated as "Donors' Day" in honor of Nassau men and women who aided the Scout movement in a recent financial drive.

Miss Peggy Martin of Brooklyn and Mattituck will play the leading role, supported by Edward C. Stanley of Rockville Centre as Wachita's Indian lover.

Hugh C. Orth of Rockville Centre will appear in several traditional Indian dances. Irving F. Southworth, student of Indian history, will narrate the story. Kenneth Fox of Rockville Centre and Katherine Fleming of Hempstead are also in the cast.

Albert S. DeClue of Hempstead has written the pageant and is general supervisor of the production. Jack Rogers of Mineola is in charge of equipment and Lawrence Muller of Cedarhurst is assisting in directing.
