SINOPSIS

Diego, believing that Torres is on the way to Monterey, goes to the Torres ranch to keep his promise to inform the Torres family the good news of their father's escape.

At the Rancho Torres Diego finds Monasterio there, questioning Elena and her mother, and making ready to have his soldiers search the house. Then Diego discovers that the fugitive has returned home and is indeed under this roof.

Diego hides Torres in the wine cellar, and from now on it will be a constant effort to keep Monasterio from discovering the fugitive.

Monasterio, though charmed by Elena, is not diverted from his task of searching for her father. He sends his soldiers all over the house.

Sergeant Garcia goes to search the wine-cellar. Diego accompanies him. Diego uses all his skill to keep the sergeant away from the dark corner where Torres hides, meanwhile giving Garcia a taste of the various wines. At last Torres gets the chance to slide away from his hiding place and up the steps.

Elena, meanwhile, to protect her father, reluctantly permits Monasterio to make advances. Wasting no time, the comandante takes her into the garden.

His amours are interrupted almost at the outset by Diego, entering the garden, merrily singing. And then and there Diego proposes marriage to Elena. This succeeds in freeing Elena from the embarrassment of Monasterio's ill-intentioned love-making.

Then Diego's continuing clever misdirections keep the searchers from discovering Torres. But Monasterio has guards posted all about the house, and he seems to be content to wait out the hideaway, so sure he is that Torres is within the walls somewhere.

So Diego is forced to take a rougher tack. He has Bernardo drop a large flower-pot on the comandante. This blow knocks him unconscious.

Torres is quickly dressed in the comandante's clothes, and he is ridden away in the comandante's carriage, with Elena and escorted by Garcia and his lancers.

Diego then quickly changes to his secret personality. And just as Garcia discovers that he is not escorting his comandante but the much sought-for fugitive, Zorro appears. He charges at the soldiers. Torres gets away once again, and Zorro makes his escape soon after, leaving Garcia to escort Elena back to her home.

When Garcia returns to the rancho Torres he is dumbfounded to discover Monasterio bound and gagged in the cellar. Garcia explains what has happened, and there crosses Monasterio's mind a suspicion regarding Diego.

These doubts are rendered absurd when a muffled cry leads them into an adjoining storeroom, where they find Diego also bound and gagged, and protesting that the evil Zorro has done this to him, just as he was trying to go to the aid of Monasterio.

Monasterio in a fury blames the two women for maneuvering Torres' escape, and he orders them arrested and taken to the cuartel.
