TV'S ZORRO YEARNS TO  
SAIL THE SOUTH PACIFIC

Guy Williams, who plays Zorro, the feared masked rider of the El Camino Real, hopes some day to sheath his sword, take the helm of his sleek racing yacht and sail to remote Easter Island, in the South Pacific.

Williams who will next be seen in the exciting Walt Disney "Zorro" segment, "The Ghost of the Mission," to be aired over station \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_ at \_\_\_\_\_ p.m., sails his own, all-steel "Oceana," a 40-foot nautical speedster with several racing credits to her name already.

"I should be able to sail her anywhere in the world," says the handsome six-foot Hollywood actor. "It's one of the best boats on the Pacific Coast.

"I'd like to be able to make for Easter Island," he adds enthusiastically. "Of course, if we couldn't get there by sail, then we could always cheat a little, and use the big diesel engine!"

In weekend shakedown cruises, the husky Williams has tested the craft in trips around Catalina Island, California, and pronounces the "Oceana" ready for any trip deemed necessary by her new master.

Williams' attractive wife, Janice, and their young son,

Stevie, have accompanied him on the local nautical ventures.

"I think Jan likes the 'Oceana' even more than I do," says Williams, with a smile. "But I doubt very much if she'd like a trip to the South Pacific."

Williams appears in the dual role of Zorro and Don Diego in the series. The supporting cast is headed by Henry Calvin, Gene Sheldon, George Lewis and Britt Lomond.
