TIME-HONORED SECRET PASSAGE LENDS SUPERNATURAL TO ZORRO

The time-honored secret passage, complete with sliding panels and a bat-filled spiral staircase, provide the hero a mobility second only to the supernatural in "A Fair Trial," a Walt Disney "Zorro" segment to be aired over station ____ on ____ at ___p.m.

Zorro (GUY WILLIAMS) is an early California superman who can come and go apparently with the facility of a ghost, appearing from nowhere when rescuing is needed, and disappearing just as completely when the forces of an evil commandante try to apprehend him.

Although no one but his mute manservant knows it, Zorro is really Don Diego de la Vega, (GUY WILLIAMS) scion of the most important family in all of Southern California. When a boy, he discovered the panels in his father's great house, along with a forgotten room, the staircase, and a long underground passage that leads to a faceless cave.

Now he uses these in his contest with the commandante who has seized military power at the Pueblo de Los Angeles.

The secret room is where he changes from the gold-braided costume of Don Diego to the black cloak and mask of Zorro. The cave is the stable for his great black horse, Tornado. And when justice must be done, man and horse ride from the cave through a heavy curtain of vines, along the length of a rock-strewn box canyon, and out into the night.
